Dear Beloved Community

These are the times when the soul starts itching a little – looking for things that will relieve the tension, looking for a way out of its shell. What is it we are supposed to do when we become dissatisfied, and we cannot fathom the source of that dissatisfaction?

This month, the Soul Matters theme of "Renewing Faith" provides us with an opportunity to think about the ways we can examine our dissatisfaction and come out the other side with a sense of hope and renewal.

Faith can be a tricky word for many Unitarian Universalists who equate faith with belief in God, or the possibility of supernatural intervention. But faith is about a kind of higher-level trust, a trust that comes from accepting that there is something more than us – even if that "more than us" is really the sum of us. It is our ability to find ways to deepen and renew our faith that helps us survive.

Spending time on practices and activities that help us define and renew faith are essential, and for each person – and each community – they may be different. A community of artists may gather to support each other through writer's or artist's block. A family may gather every year at a reunion which presents an opportunity to relive memories and pass along traditions to the younger generation. Many people need a change in scenario or time spent in nature to renew their faith. Time spent mentoring youth renews our faith in the future. And time engaging with others in social action work or community service is the most impactful way I know to renew your faith in society.

As Unitarian Universalists, we have a wide range of tools available to us to renew our faith – something which is necessary at many points in our lives. Even when we feel no "soul itch," a regular practice of renewing our faith is a worthy endeavor – something that is "baked in" to many faith traditions through observances like Lent, Yom Kippur, Ramadan, and the various pilgrimage routes around the world.

As we travel towards spring, let us find ways to affirm one another in our desire to renew our faith, trusting that beloved community is the sanctuary that will embolden us to ask and answer our most important questions.

Each of the four weeks was jam-packed with a "playlist" or "menu" of activities focused on Side With Love's justice priorities. The third and last **Share The Plate (STP)** collection for the **Shinnecock Families and Children** is on **Sun. March 6, 2022.** We will **also** be holding a **drive-through collection of non-food items and monetary donations on Sat., March 26th, 12 noon - 2:00pm at back of our church parking. A list of needed item includes, but is not limited to:**

- Laundry detergent / dish soap

- Incontinent supplies
- Shampoo and conditioner
- Toothpaste and toothbrushes
